Heidegger shrugged in despair: “Only a God can save us!” Such proclamations led his colleague Karl-Otto Apel to suggest sardonically that Heidegger suffered from a “forgetting of reason” (Logosvergessenheit) The other major theme of Heidegger’s postwar writings was technology In his view, technology had come to dominate all aspects of modern life
